Psychology at Deakin University

From 2017, Deakin University will be offering *new* specialist courses in psychology. Students can apply for one course – **Bachelor of Psychology (Professional Streams)**, and have access to four specialist professional streams to choose from:

1. **forensic psychology**
2. **organisational psychology**
3. **child and family psychology**
4. **health psychology**

Tax File Number (TFN)

Any student will need a tax file number if he/she starts work (part-time and full-time) and all students planning on a tertiary education require one when they start.

Importantly, current Year 12 students are reminded that they cannot enrol in a CSP (Commonwealth Support Place) course at university without a Tax File Number, so it is worthwhile getting an application submitted early!

Students must apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office. **To apply and to find out about participating Post Offices, visit [TFN Application](#)**

Scholarships available to experience a week as a marine biologist

Year 11 and 12 students could win a scholarship to spend a week studying the unique marine environment on Tasmania's pristine Maria Island and get a taste of what it could be like to study with the University of Tasmania.

Five interstate and four Tasmanian winners have a chance to participate in the *Practical Introduction to Temperate Marine Biology* program, 19 April to 24 April 2017*.

The scholarship covers:

- The field excursion fee of \$645
- Accommodation, airport transfers and return economy airfares from your nearest capital city to Hobart for the five interstate winners
- Return transport from Hobart to Maria Island, including ferry crossings
- All catering while on Maria Island
- Hire of all required diving and survey gear

To enter students should register their details on the IMAS website. Students are required to fill out the "Marine Discovery Scholarship Application Form 2017" including 300 words on why they want to explore the marine environment on Maria Island, and return to Scott Ling before **midnight AEST on Tuesday 07 March 2017**.

There is a limit of 24 places. After the nine scholarships have been awarded paying places on the course will be offered based on the strength of the student's 300-word application.

Studying Health Sciences at Monash

Are you passionate about health and keen to contribute to addressing real health challenges whether they confront individuals or communities? If so, Health Science at Monash is for you.

This course at Monash provides students with a sound foundation in health science, and a broad overview of health care, and skills in identifying, investigating, analysing and assessing health issues. This foundation builds to four specialisations, enabling students to pursue a variety of allied and public health career paths:

- **Emergency Health and Paramedic Practice**
- **Human Services**
- **Public Health Science**
- **Radiation Sciences**

The first half of the degree will focus on building a core foundation in human disease and healthcare. Students will be exposed to the influence of biological, behavioural, developmental, social and environmental determinants of health.

Having acquired the basic scientific, anatomical and epidemiological knowledge that students will utilise throughout their career, students will then begin their specialist studies in the second half of the second year. Depending on their choice, this may mean broadening their engagement from the Caulfield campus (where the common units are taught) to the Clayton and Peninsula campuses.

The VCE prerequisite subjects are Units 3 & 4: a study score of at least 30 in English (EAL) or 25 in English other than EAL, and Units 3 & 4: a study score of at least 22 in Mathematical Methods (any) or Specialist Mathematics, or a score of at least 25 in Further Mathematics.
