Tax File Number (TFN)

Any student will need a tax file number if he/she starts work (part-time and full-time) and all students planning on a tertiary education require one when they start.

Importantly, current Year 12 students are reminded that they cannot enrol in a CSP (Commonwealth Support Place) course at university without a Tax File Number, so it is worthwhile getting an application submitted early!

Students must apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office. **To apply and to find out about participating Post Offices, visit [TFN Application](#)**

Biomedical Science at Monash

Monash University offers the Bachelor of Biomedical Sciences, a 3-year degree taught at the Clayton Campus. First-year units cover biomedical chemistry, medical biophysics, human neurobiology, and other key areas – setting the foundations of professional development, which will be enriched by second- and third-year units in areas such as human genetics, bioinformatics, and molecular mechanisms of disease. In this interdisciplinary course, students will learn about the science of body systems and the design and use of biomedical data. Students will gain the skills they need to understand and investigate human biology and make a difference to human health in a wide variety of career paths.

As a graduate, students may find work in the hospital and medical sector, including medical diagnostic laboratories; secondary and tertiary teaching; media and communications; and the government sector in such areas as health promotion and health economics. **This is also the preferred undergraduate degree to Graduate Medicine at Monash University.**

Bachelor of Midwifery/Bachelor of Nursing

The Bachelor of Midwifery/Bachelor of Nursing is a new course that will be offered in 2017, subject to being accredited by the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council (ANMAC).

Midwifery and nursing are two distinct disciplines with shared understandings, knowledge and practice skills in professional health care. Students studying this course will undertake a varied and extensive program, which will give them the competency and confidence to work as midwives and nurses.

The Bachelor of Midwifery/Bachelor of Nursing is a four year full-time, dual undergraduate degree. Graduates will be eligible to register as Registered Midwives and Registered Nurses with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia.

Our course has a woman-centred approach in the Bachelor of Midwifery. Midwives provide comprehensive, professional care focused on a woman's individual needs and expectations. In the Bachelor of Nursing there is a balanced approach to person-centred quality care across the lifespan.
